On *Campus* I, the largest area of PUC-Campinas and where more than 50% of the University's students study, are located the dependencies of the Dean.

This land was donated by two sisters Vera and Ana Beatriz, daughters of Caio Pinto Guimarães an agricultural engineer and the former owner of Santa Cândida farm. Guimarães had a dream to build a university on the farm's prime location.

The construction of the buildings started in 1970. Three years later, the Institute of Arts, Communication and Tourism — IACT became operational and the Faculty of Physical Education — FAEFI. The *Campus* was inaugurated on the 15th March 1973.

Courses run at this location are part of the Centre for Economics and Administration — CEA -, the Centre for Exact Sciences, Technology and the Environment — CEATEC -, the Centre for Human and Applied Social Sciences (except Law) — CCHSA - and the Centre for Language and Communication — CLC.

Campus II is known as the "City of Health", due to the fact that together in one place are the University Hospital and the Centre for Life Sciences Courses — CCV, composed of the Faculties for Biological Sciences, Pharmaceutical Sciences, Nursing, Physiotherapy, Speech Therapy, Medicine, Nutrition, Dentistry, Psychology and Occupational Therapy.

The Celso Pierro Maternity Hospital is a benchmark for Campinas and the region, it has hospital beds available for the use of the public Unified Health System (SUS) and for private partnerships and individuals, throughout the Inpatient Units and the Emergency Department for adults, pediatrics, gynaecology, obstetrics and orthopaedics, as well as adult, pediatrics, neonatal and coronary Intensive Care Units (UTi's).

The Central *Campus* is the birthsite of PUC-Campinas. The University was founded on this site in 1941. The building was the old Mansion House property of Joaquim Policarpo Aranha — Itapura Baron -, and its Patio of the Lions is a popular place for student gathering, parties and events.

In the Central *Campus* the Law Course is housed, within the Centre for Human and Applied Social Sciences – CCHSA.

The Library and Information System – SBI consists of five libraries, two in *Campus* I, one in *Campus* II, one in the Central *Campus* and another one in the Collage Application Pius XII directed at Primary and Secondary Education. Its equipment and collections are updated annually at the request of the faculties. In the library's collections are books, thesis and papers, as well as special items (such as brochures, CD's and DVD's), periodicals, rare works and special items.

EDUCATION EVALUATION

For five years now, PUC-Campinas has been organizing, every six months, its Educational Evaluation — a process by which the students could express their opinions on the quality of the learning experience at the University. This is done by means of a questionnaire available from the Student Login Area (www.puc-campinas.edu.br).


The students' opinions are processed, analyzed and respected, often bringing major benefits in helping further improve the quality of education offered by PUC-Campinas.

The results of the questionnaires are sent to the directors of the Centres, to be discussed with Faculty directors and in meetings involving professors and students.



MONITORING OF ACADEMIC STUDENTS PROJECT - PAAA

The Monitoring of Academic Students Project — PAAA - helps to integrate the PUC-Campinas student into academic life, monitoring their course performance, attending to their needs and expectations, and assisting with their transition from the University to the world of work. The PAAA is divided into three stages, each of which has its specific objectives, all aimed at the complete education and support of the student.





COMMUNITY LEARNING PROGRAM - PROCAP

Consists of activities designed for all courses freshmen and its content is aimed at the development of academic areas such as Mathematics, Biology, Chemistry and Literature and the availability of practical support through the Virtual Learning Environment (AVA). This involves senior students of Undergrad and grad Courses with the monitoring of teachers.

SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH INICIATION PROGRAM

Scientific Research Iniciation Program is the first step for the student in getting to know how to develop a research project. In PUC-Campinas, the Program offers two types of scholarships for Undergraduate students: Dean Scholarships/FAPIC and PIBIC and PIBITI/CNPq scholarships, administered through the University under the supervision of CNPq, a federal agency. To participate in the program the student must be enrolled in a regular Undergraduation Course of PUC-Campinas, not be in employment, must not be linked to paid training, have completed the disciplines relevant to the execution of its IC Work Plan, have 20 hours per week to devote to research activities, be selected and appointed by a research professor, fulfill the plan of activities approved and finally analyze and present the results at the Annual Scientific Research Meeting sponsored by the University.

Non-mandatory internships are conducted through the many institutional partnerships both with private and public owned companies, allowing students to be exposed to their future professional environment. At PUC-Campinas, Work towards Course Completion is different. Here it is the synthesis of a process of training towards undergraduation. The TCC provides the students with the opportunity of production orientated training via a combination of theory and practice.



MONITORING



Monitoring activities are undertaken to improve undergraduate education. This program encourages senior students to act as monitors for their colleagues, seeking to assist them in the subjects in which they have difficulties. Thus, the teaching-learning process becomes more dynamic with encouragement to promote and discuss new ways of sharing knowledge. Applications are semi-annual and monitors can be paid or be voluntary.

Dozens of extension courses are available twice yearly through the University's portal (www.puc-campinas.edu.br). They are open to the entire community, independent of previous education.

EXCHANGE

For those interested in international exchange, PUC-Campinas has agreements with various educational institutions from abroad. The facilitator for international student experiences is the Department for External Relations – DRE, which promotes lectures, presentations, exhibitions, workshops, informing students about courses, programs and scholarships abroad.

The DRE also has responsibility for National and International Cooperation Projects for the University, whose purpose is to foster information exchange, furtherance of knowledge and encouraging the comprehensive education of students and teachers.



COMMUNITY

The University Museum of PUC-Campinas conducts cultural activities such as exhibitions and displays of its collection.

The Collection of the museum consists of five Thematic Collections: "Indiginous Ethnic Groups", "Pre Industrial Japan", "Archaeology", "History of the PUC" and "Folklore and Popular Culture". It features books, journals, magazines, videos, sound recordings, records and CD's.

The museums Collection is currently stored in the Palace of Baron Itapura (Rua Marechal Deodoro, 1099 — Central Campus) and the Safety Area (Technical Reserve) of Campus I of the University, and is publicly available for visits and research.
